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Foreword

This European Standard has been prepared by Technical Committee CEN/TC 248 "Textiles and textile products", the secretariat of which is held by BSI.

It is related to ISO 3635 :1981; prEN ISO 3635:1996 was submitted to the Unique Acceptance Procedure (UAP) in CEN on 1996-10-24. Since the result of the UAP was negative, CEN/TC 248 examined the reasons for negative votes and modified the ISO Standard to suit the European needs. This European Standard is the result of this work.

Introduction

This European Standard is intended as a reference document to be consulted in conjunction with the European Standard for the size designation of clothes applicable to the garment under consideration.

1 Scope

This European Standard defines body dimensions for garments, specifies a procedure for measuring the body and gives pictograms to be used on garment labels.

2 Normative references

This European Standard incorporates, by dated or undated references, provisions from other publications. These normative references are cited at the appropriate places in the text and the publications are listed hereafter. For dated references, subsequent amendments or revisions of any of these publications apply to this European Standard only when incorporated in it by amendment or revision. For undated references the latest edition of the publications referred to applies (including amendments).

3 Terms and definitions

For the purposes of this Standard, the following terms and definitions apply.

3.1

primary dimension

a body measurement, in centimetres, that shall be used in designating the size of a garment. (see prEN 13402-2, in preparation, at enquiry stage with number prEN 13764)

3.2


secondary dimension

a body measurement, in centimetres, or, in the case of pantyhose, body mass (kg), that may additionally be used in designating the size of a garment (see prEN 13402-2, in preparation, at enquiry stage with number prEN 13764)

3.3

standard pictogram

pictorial symbol used to indicate the position on the body of the relevant dimensions
