Small craft — Craft identification — Coding system

1 Scope

This document establishes a coding system to achieve identification of any small craft in terms of:

- a) identification code of the country of the manufacturer of the craft;
- b) identification code of the manufacturer;
- c) serial number;
- d) month and year of manufacture;
- e) model year.

This document is applicable to small craft of all types and materials, of hull length, $L_{\rm H}$, up to 24 m.

craft identification number

watercraft identification number

unique series of numerals, letters and a hyphen, permanently affixed to a craft hull

3.2

manufacturer

natural or legal person who manufactures a product, or has such a product designed and/or manufactured, and markets that product under his name or trademark

3.3

country of manufacturer

country where the *manufacturer* (3.2) who places the product on the market is established
