3 Terms and definitions

For the purposes of this part of ISO 15098, the terms and definitions open in ISO 1942-3 and the following apply.

pin for guiding the tweezer halves when the tweezers are pressed together

4 Design and dimensions

4.1 General

General requirements for dental tweezers are specified in ISO 15098-1.

College type dental tweezers shall have the designs shown in Figures 1 and 2 and the dimensions as given in Table 1. The points of measurement associated with the dimensions are listed in Table 2.

Annex A of ISO 15098-1:1999 provides details of one method of measurement applicable to most types of dental tweezers.

College type dental tweezers are grouped into the following types according to the shape of the working end:

- type 1: angled;
- type 2: curved.
