Introduction

Table mounted chairs are widely used throughout Europe as seats for children.

This European Standard harmonises the minimum safety requirements and test methods for table mounted chairs.

1 Scope

This European Standard specifies safety requirements and the corresponding test methods for table mounted chairs, intended for children who are able to sit by themselves (approximately 6 months old) and up to 15 kg.

This European Standard deals only with safety and does not purport to establish particular designs or special construction methods for the table mounted chairs themselves.

2 Normative references

3 Definitions

For the purposes of this European Standard, the following definitions apply :

Chair normally used for children that is intended to be attached to a table or other horizontal surface.
