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## BRIEF HISTORY

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The ISO Recommendation R 51, Pipe Lines for the Transport of Combustible Liquids - Nominal Diameters, was drawn up by the Technical Committee ISO / TC 9, Shipbuilding Details for Inland Navigation, the Secretariat of which is held by the Hoofdcommissie voor de Normalisatie in Nederland (HCNN).

At its initial meeting (held in Paris, June 1949) the Technical Committee unanimously decided to adopt as a Draft ISO Recommendation the nominal diameters as mentioned in this Recommendation.

In March 1954, the Draft ISO Recommendation proposed by the Technical Committee ISO / TC 9 was submitted to all the ISO Member Bodies. It was approved by the following 19 (out of a total of 33) Member Bodies:

No Member Bodies opposed the approval of the Draft.

Moreover, Technical Committee ISO / TC 5, Pipes and Fittings, expressed its agreement with the Draft.

The Draft ISO Recommendation was then submitted by correspondence to the ISO Council which decided, in August 1957, to accept it as an ISO RECOMMENDATION.
