Foreword

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Draft International Standards adopted by the technical committees are circulated to the member bodies for voting. Publication as an International Standard requires approval by at least 75 % of the member bodies casting a vote.

1 Scope

This International Standard describes a method for the determination of trace elements in green and calcined coke with an ash content of not greater than 10 % (m/m) and with individual concentrations not greater than the following:

Calcium	0,025 % (m/m)
Chromium	0,005 % (m/m)
Copper	0,025 % (m/m)
Iron	0,030 % (m/m)
Lead	0,010 % (m/m)
Magnesium	0,010 % (m/m)
Manganese	0,001 % (m/m)
Nickel	0,050 % (m/m)
Silicon	0,100 % (m/m)
Vanadium	0,100 % (m/m)
Zinc	0,004 % (m/m)

NOTE — A method for the determination of ash of cokes is given in ISO 8005:1984, *Carbonaceous materials used in the production of aluminium — Green and calcined coke — Determination of ash*. However, it is essential that the ash produced by that method not be used in the procedure of this International Standard because of the risk of contamination by trace elements.
